Meals have always been important across societies and cultures – a time for friends and families to come together. Sharing food is a vital part of how we build relationship one with another; an aspect of community that we haven't been able to fully express during several months of restriction due to Covid-19. In Luke's gospel - his record of Jesus' life and ministry - Luke tells us about several such occasions where Jesus and his friends sat and chatted over a meal table. Just like us, Jesus and his friends celebrated occasions, remembered past events, and used their time profitably to get to know each other better. In our all-together Sunday morning services over the remainder of this summer we will be exploring seven such meals. Alongside Luke's gospel we will be using resources from Ed Drew's **Meals with Jesus** devotional book. Join us as we meet with Jesus and his friends as they sit around the meal table. Listen in as Jesus tells his friends more about who he is, about what he came to achieve, and why it is that we can place our whole trust in him.
