

Imagine what would happen if all of us looked around at the people we spend our days with and asked God: how do you want me to be good news to these people today? That's the question we will be exploring over five Sunday mornings in a series called Frontline Sundays.

Join us in-person or online as we consider what it means to be whole-life disciples both scattered and gathered; in our everyday contexts during the week and in our times together on a Sunday.



In our Home Groups this term we will be thinking more about what it means to follow Jesus in the whole of life. In a series of seven studies entitled The Whole of Life for **Christ** we will be exploring how to bring glory to Christ in the everyday hustle and bustle of our lives. Paul writing to the church in Corinth reminds his friends that 'if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: the old has gone the new is here!' (1 Corinthians 5:17). That new life, empowered

The writer to the Hebrews tells his readers. 'Remember those in prison as if you were their fellow-prisoners, and those who are illtreated as if you yourselves were international suffering' (Hebrews 13:3). Have you ever wondered what it would be like to meet in


secret as an underground church? On Sunday 6th February we will be welcoming a group from **People International** who will help us answer that question. On two occasions during the day and at other times during the week there will be a chance to learn more about the experiences of our brothers and sisters across the world who meet in far tougher situations than our own. Timothy was a young man whom Paul had left in charge of a big church. If he didn't make the right choices, the church might easily send out the wrong signals, and give a misleading impression, to the pagan onlookers of Ephesus who were watching critically. So Paul wrote a

letter which can still help us detect the ways in which other people may look at our church life together and be put off by Christians, rather than attracted by Jesus. As we look at serving God on our Frontlines in our morning series, it's important to think about what's happening in the trenches. So why not join us on Sunday 9th January at 5:00pm for the first of six studies entitled Back behind the Frontline.

Abraham is one of the most important characters in the Bible. But why should a man who lived nearly four thousand years ago still matter to us as twenty-first century Christians? This year as we journey through the season of Lent we will be travelling alongside Abraham

and his wife Sarah as they encounter challenges, doubts, false alarms and unbelievable promises. Join us for a six-part series of late Sunday afternoon sessions exploring the story of this remarkable journey through word, film, prayer, discussion and music. The series starts on **Sunday 6th March at** 5:00pm.



Starting on **Sunday 27th February**, the second of this term's morning series returns to the theme of mental wellness in a follow-up to our first Living with Thorns series back in 2018. This series aims to help us focus on God even in the midst of the brokenness we experience. Many, if not all of us, can testify to difficult

experiences which will serve as a constant reminder that we live in a fallen world. Yet, as this series seeks to explore, God is present with us in them. Each week we will be looking at a different well-known Old Testament Bible story linked to a Hebrew name for God. This series will include many personal testimonies and practical advice for those living or sharing life with others who require support with issues of mental wellbeing.

We expect to welcome two visiting speakers during this series, Katharine Hill from Care for the Family on Sunday 6th March and Ruth Rice, the founder of Renew Wellbeing Café Network on Sunday 20th March.



Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, the four Gospel writers, each tell the story of Easter in very different ways. Over four Sunday mornings starting on **Sunday 27th March**, in a series entitled **Meeting Jesus** we explore four separate encounters that happened in the days

leading up to Jesus' death and resurrection. Each story, whether using parable, prophecy or personal encounter, has much to teach us about how God's story can be forever linked to our own.
