

'Come and see' was how Jesus invited Andrew and John, His first two followers, to join Him on a journey of discovery. This same invitation was extended, implicitly or explicitly, to many other

people during the next two or three years. It was met with different responses. Some realised that Jesus was the Messiah, God's chosen One, the person they had been seeking. Others were taken by surprise, recognising that He was the answer to situations in which they were trapped. But others had a vested interest in denying Jesus' identity and turned against Him in fear and anger. As we follow the story of John's Gospel over several months, what will our response be to Jesus' invitation to 'come and see'?

Over recent years, there have been several cries for justice in our world whether race, gender-related, social or economic. God's prophets are amongst the most powerful and effective voices

ever heard for keeping religion honest, humble, compassionate and just. Among those prophets, Amos stands out as the defender of the poor and the accuser of the powerful rich: those who use God's name to legitimise their self-serving religiosity. The book of Amos calls God's people to return to true worship centred on justice: a message as relevant today as it was when first written.

God created us to be in relationship with Himself and with others. In the New Testament, there are over fifty references about how we ought to relate to 'one another.' Many of these passages

address not only our behaviour, but also our attitude. Most of the 'one another' statements are instructions describing how we relate to each other as Christ's followers. But imagine what those same attitudes and actions could reveal about the transformational power of the 'good news' of Jesus if we applied them to every-day situations we meet on our frontlines.

Jesus' prayer in John 17 is full of movement. It's a prayer that invites us not simply to listen to Jesus as He prays, but to be involved with Him as He prays, and to draw alongside Him as He

connects very deeply with His Father. Over three evenings in a series called **With Jesus in the Garden** we will be exploring how Jesus' prayer helps to shape our own prayer lives through increasing our understanding of His identity and mission.
