The book of Acts tells of the early days of the church as they start living as witnesses for Jesus. This group of people were from all walks of life who had a shared belief and experience of Jesus Christ. As we

read the early chapters of Acts, we see their surprise at what God is doing, their passion to join in the work of God and be faithful to all that they had seen and heard alongside Jesus. Empowered and equipped by the Spirit of Jesus, they took bold steps to declare the good news of Jesus. Pentecost challenges us again to be witnesses locally and globally. As we listen let's consider where Jesus wants us to be His witnesses as we 'Share the Story, Live the Life'.



The Old Testament Prophet Malachi calls God's people back to live faithfully throughout their lives. Compromise and half-heartedness have crept in to their worship and obedience of God. Malachi causes

people to see where they are falling short of God's intentions for them. We can easily find ourselves subject to drift and compromise. Malachi's call challenges us again to return to God our saviour, and king.



Away from home, living in a different culture. Daniel is a follower of God who stands his ground. When all around us are living differently what helps us to stand up and live distinctively for

the Lord regardless of the risk? The stories of the first few chapters of Daniel show us someone who is confident in the one he follows, and encourages to have courageous confidence in our God who can save.

Who are we? What are we to do? If God has done, through Jesus Christ, all of these amazing things described earlier in the letter to Rome, then what does it mean for each of us? We're in different

relationships with God, and our lives are following a different path. Paul writes about a life energized and equipped by the Spirit. We're digging deep into Romans 8 where we find answers to these most fundamental questions.



The amazing message of Jesus Christ is to be lived out. The young church in Rome was faced with this challenge in a city and culture driven by power, status, idol worship. The latter part of Romans

addresses the 'live' issues disrupting the witness of the diverse community of faith. This series will help understand the social, political, and religious context of Rome in the 1st century and will help us apply Paul's teaching to our own different, and yet in many ways similar, world in 21st century Exeter.



The good news of Jesus brings transformation for individuals and the world. In this series we'll reflect themes (all beginning with RE-) by going through particular Bible

passages. There will be time to reflect upon what God has done and is now doing in us. And also how we can be part of His work to see this change in His world.
